This 3-day course combines the content of ICISF's Assisting Individuals in Crisis & Group Crisis Intervention courses.

Crisis Intervention is NOT psychotherapy; rather, it is a specialized acute emergency mental health intervention which requires specialized training. As physical first aid is to surgery, crisis intervention is to psychotherapy. Thus, crisis intervention is sometimes called "emotional first aid". Designed to present the core elements of a comprehensive, systematic and multi-component crisis intervention curriculum, this course will prepare participants to understand a wide range of crisis intervention services for both the individual and for groups. Fundamentals of Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) will be outlined and participants will leave with the knowledge and tools to provide several group crisis interventions, specifically demobilizations, defusings and the Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD). The need for appropriate follow-up services and referrals when necessary will also be discussed.

This course is designed for anyone in the fields of Business & Industry Crisis Intervention, Disaster Response, Education, Emergency Services, Employee Assistance, Healthcare, Homeland Security, Mental Health, Military, Spiritual Care, and Traumatic Stress. This course provides 27 hours of CE.

Mental Health, EMS, Fire and TCOLE CE are pending. This course is open to anyone living or working in the following counties: Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Frio, Guadalupe, Gillespie, Karnes, Kendall, Kerr, McMullen, Medina, and Wilson.

This course is sponsored/funded by District 7 Fire & Rescue through a grant from the Texas Criminal Justice Division, Office of the Governor. District 7 Fire & Rescue is spearheading the effort to build capacity in the AACOG of crisis intervention and peer support for first responder agencies.
